BAR SOCIAL & SUGAR CANE APPLY FOR LONGER HOURS



Both Bar Social and Sugar Cane have applied to the council to increase their hours of operation. The bars, between 245 and 249 Lavender Hill, are seeking to extend their hours of operation, particularly at week-ends when both hope to open until 2am.

What is likely to cause most disruption to neighbours is that they both want to remove restrictions on use of the outside areas so smokers can use it at any time the bar is open.

The council has traditionally resisted allowing outside areas to open late because of the noise for neighbours, but the smoking ban means more pressure to relax those rules.

However the developers then appealed to Boris Johnson, claiming the hotel had strategic importance to the London plan and he, not the council, should decide if the hotel should be built.



NEW COMMUNITY PLAYGROUND AT JOHN BURNS



Shaftesbury residents with children will benefit from a new playground at John Burns' School which will also be open for community use when the school is closed.

The playground, costing £105,000 was opened in June. During school hours the playground will be for the exclusive use of the school - but in the evenings, at weekends and during school holidays the gate on Wickersley Road will be opened to allow community use.

The playground features a gyro, climbing wall, turbo slide, climbing rope net, spinning dish, balancing unit and sheltered seating - all on a soft play surface.

Preventing crime

With the warmer weather the borough has seen an increase in burglaries in which criminals have taken advantage of doors and windows being left open.

It only takes a few seconds for a burglar to climb in and grab a few items of value, and many crimes have taken place when the householder was just in another room for a few minutes.

Most burglars are opportunists who will be put off by a few simple measures:

- 1. Make sure you close and lock windows and doors if you are not in the room an agile burglar can be in and out quickly.
- 2. Fit windows locks, these can stop the window opening so burglars can't get in without breaking a window they usually won't want to risk the attention.
- 3. Never leave your keys visible from the outside they can often be 'hooked' by burglars and used to get into your house, shed or garage or even be used to take your car.
