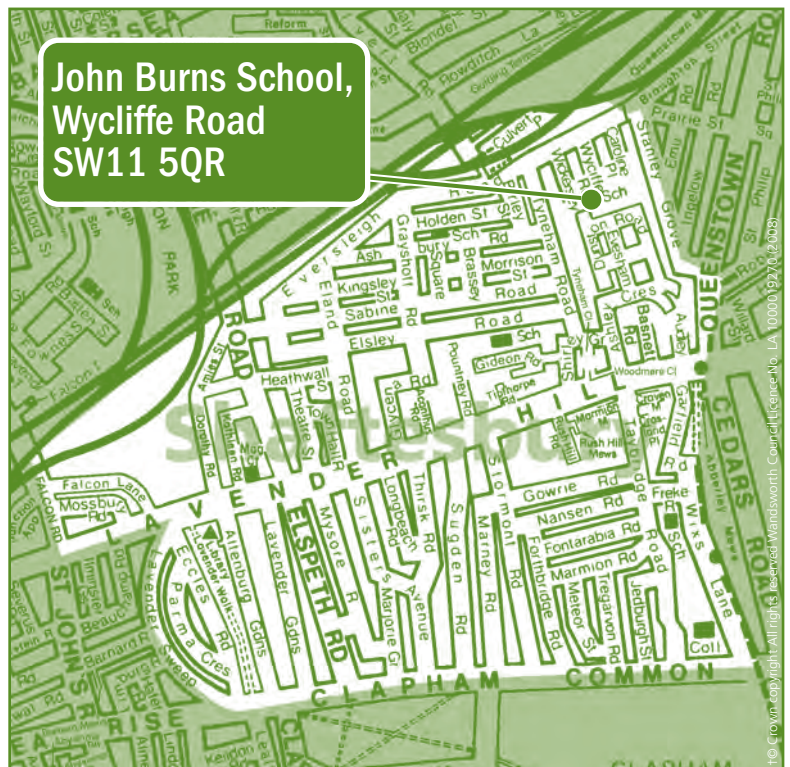
### The council wants to know what you think about life in Shaftesbury ward.

## Around the Ward

**Events on Clapham Common** These events are increasing in frequency and your councillors are concerned about the noise and disturbance they cause. They are held on the part of the common which is in Lambeth and are licensed by Lambeth Council.

**Lavender Hill library** The library is now fully reopen after a refurbishment which includes a new self service system.

**Local free school** Your local councillors are working with local activists to see if it is possible to establish a 'free' primary school in the area to give greater choice to local families.

**Clapham Junction Station improvements** After many years of campaigning, and with the help of a council grant, a step-free entrance to Clapham Junction station has opened in St John's Hill, with another ticket office and lifts to all platforms.

**No right turn** An experimental scheme to ban right turns off Clapham Common Northside has been introduced, after many years of complaints from local residents. The scheme will be reviewed shortly to see how effective it has been and whether any benefits are outweighed by inconvenience.

**Exemplar Scheme** The 'exemplar' scheme around Asda is now underway, with much improved pavements. Changes to the road layout will be brought in later.

**Late bars on Lavender Hill** Your councillors are concerned by the noise and disturbance caused by late opening bars on some parts of Lavender Hill and will be watching this issue closely.

\*3 year average figures are used to even out annual fluctuations. No allowance has been made for either pupils with special educational needs or those with English as an additional language.

\*\*Each pupil's value-added score is based on comparing their Key Stage 2 performance with the median - or middle - performance of other pupils with the same or similar results at Key Stage 1. The individual scores are averaged for the school, to give a score that is represented as a number based around 100. This indicates the value the school has added on average for their pupils. Figures above 100 show that pupils have made more progress than expected, based on their previous attainment, and scores less than 100 show that pupils have made less progress than expected.
